Charles Anakweze Recognized by the National Institutes of Health (NIH)

Dynanet contributed to the upgrade/migration of NIAID network infrastructure through the implementation of modified communications such as Lync, Video Conferencing, and VoIP. New modules and power supplies were added to facilitate power over Ethernet, and the switch from a 1GB to 10GB backbone resulted in an overall increase in network performance by 100%. With such a significant increase in network performance, NIAID now realizes substantial growth potential. On December 16, 2014, Charles Anakweze, Dynanet network engineer, was recognized for his significant contributions to the success of this project.

Jaime Hernandez Recognized by DOI for Excellent Customer Service

Roy Wood, Senior Software Developer



I'm Roy Wood and I joined Dynanet in February 2010. Prior to joining Dynanet I was involved with managing successful modernization projects at Export Import Bank, SIRVA, and the Department of Energy. I also owned my own company, Logic Unlimited, Inc. that provided training/consulting services to state, local and federal agencies and commercial enterprises. At OPM, my role has been making sure the current documentation of the business rules mirrors production, researching and documenting the real data content, and clarifying all the issues between what exists and the "to be" data architecture, and data purification and migration to the "to be" database. I developed standards and a training program to quickly address the documentation of business rules and suggested generating the basic set of program code rather than write 100s of programs. The code generation approach was carried forward to data scanning and purification and eventually put us way ahead of schedule.

Dynanet is the best company I have ever encountered, including my own. Dynanet offers great benefits, but more important is led by a management team that cares. Sean Peay, Dynanet CEO, has taken the time to meet with our team and make sure we feel part of the family. Gary Duchaine, OPM Program Manager, is the best I know. Project Spotlight

Meet Dynanet's CSTAR Team

For nearly 12 years Dynanet has developed custom software solutions for the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). For the last three years, Dynanet has partnered with Edaptive Systems to deliver those solutions to FDA's Center for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH). Dynanet currently operates and enhances two key systems as part of the CDRH Center Submission Tracking And Reporting (CSTAR) contract:

- The Center Tracking System (CTS) is a workflow tracking, case management system that automates the premarket approval of medical devices like pacemakers, surgical implants, and contact lenses. CTS also automates business processes related to post market surveillance, medical device recalls, and even FDA approvals of public laser shows. CTS is a custom Java application based on Struts, runs on Apache Tomcat, and stores its information in an Oracle 11g database. CTS has won several FDA awards since going live in 2004.
- Dynanet started the CDRH Entry (CEntry) project in 2011 to replace 250 Oracle forms and several non-integrated databases with a custom Java application and a relational, integrated database. CEntry automates the operation of CDRH's document control center and receives the data that CDRH needs to perform the premarket review with CTS. It is based on Spring, Hibernate, Apache Tomcat, and Oracle 11g. The modernization project is about 50% complete.

Both systems help CDRH protect and promote the public health by ensuring that patients and providers have timely and continued access to safe, effective, and high-quality medical devices and safe radiation-emitting products.

After the end-user release of CTS and CEntry, CDRH Deputy Director for Premarket Program Management stated, *"I am [in] awe of how smoothly everything with this deployment proceeded this weekend. Thanks to everyone who played a role in this deployment! I think we have reached our stride as a team and am looking forward to working with all of you in many more successful releases."*

Dynanet follows the Scrum and Kanban agile techniques to enhance CTS and CEntry with new releases every few months. Each release is divided into multiple three-week sprints consisting of a planning session; design, development, and testing of new features; demos of the new features to end users; team retrospectives on how to improve; and daily meetings (scrums). Electronic Kanban boards identify the current workflow states of each feature planned for the sprint (e.g., development, testing, ready for customer review, or completed). All teams participate in weekly scrum of scrum meetings as well as a monthly “meta scrum” with customer executives.

Our team includes a project/release manager (Johnson Wilson), business analysts (Allen Hill and Helena Tepper), system architects (Natasha Alekseyeva, Chris Barlow, James Cooper, and Sandeep De), senior developers (Vikas Gupta, Sridhar Nallapu, and Horacio Recalde), test engineers (Malik Awan, Natalya Mirlas, and Hema Ponnuvel), a configuration manager (Chad Jasper), two help desk specialists (Rosebel Akhlaq and Kene Ejinaka), and a program manager (Mike McEwen), who also oversees about 20 people from Edaptive Systems.
