Dynanet Wins BPA to Support OPM October 2015

Dynanet won a Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) at the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) for Enterprise Case Management System Services (ECMS). The contract vehicle has a five year period of performance. The project scope is similar to the support that we have been providing for OPM's Strategic Information Technology Plan in support of operation and maintenance (O&M) and modernization of the legacy Case Management System Personnel Investigation Processing System (PIPS).

Dynanet Wins DOI AV Contract February 2016

Dynanet has been awarded a contract to provide Audio Visual Services to the Office of Facilities and Administrative Services (OFAS) at the Department of Interior. Under this contract Dynanet will provide OFAS with a comprehensive set of multi-media audiovisual services for approximately 2,000 employees, plus external customers that includes visual pre-production, production, post-production, video conferencing, press conferences, conference room multi-media support, satellite broadcasts and technical support for 1,000 conference room meetings. Congratulations to Victoria Weaver and Jaime Hernandez. Their outstanding performance supporting this customer was instrumental in our ability to retain this contract.

Dynanet FDA Team Prepares to Deploy New Releases February 2016

Dynanet's 20-person software solutions team at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recently achieved a major milestone by developing two important revisions of systems that help the Center for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH) protect and promote public health. The software releases, scheduled for deployment to production in February, will replace Oracle forms and non-integrated databases with a custom Java application and a relational, integrated database. This work is part of a multiyear contract to modernize the operation of CDRH's document control center, which receives the data that FDA needs to perform its premarket reviews and approvals of medical products.

Before a medical device may be marketed in the U.S., a company must obtain FDA clearance. Typically, marketing clearance is obtained by submitting an application (also known as a premarket submission) to CDRH. In some cases, companies may also request device exemptions from the FDA. The releases will improve CDRH's handling of Premarket Approval (PMA) submissions and Humanitarian Device Exemptions (HDEs). CDRH receives about 6,000 PMAs and 500 HDEs every year.

To create the releases, Dynanet team members followed Scrum and Kanban to complete 16 three-week development sprints and a final hardening sprint. Dynanet business analysts (serving as Scrum product owners) carefully planned each development sprint with business stakeholders, led weekly meetings with the stakeholders to ensure timely feedback to developers, and led eight hands-on user acceptance testing sessions with CDRH staff. The software developers and testers did not have the luxury of focusing on just the PMA-HDE releases but also had to

deliver quarterly maintenance releases and start development of the next major releases due in June 2016. Dynanet's configuration manager deployed daily builds and maintained 14 different development and testing environments.

The new releases enhance the CDRH Document Entry (CEntry) system and the Center Tracking System (CTS). Those systems help CDRH protect and promote the public health by ensuring that patients and providers have timely and continued access to safe, effective, and high-quality medical devices and safe radiation-emitting products.

Dynanet Participates in GSA IT Contractor Collaboration Event (C2e)

Dynanet attended another very successful C2e event. This event included an ongoing discussion on securing GSA's IT assets to include both hardware and application software. The committee has developed a "forum" site to create discussion threads to hit all topics discussed since the inception of C2E. The site also has a polling engine to solicit opinion and comments from all participants. Dynanet participants include Mike Rice, Paul Volpe and Kalyan Gadde. The goal of the committee is to produce a collaborative white paper from GSA's contractor community on moving forward to protect GSA's IT portfolios. The next C2e will be hosted by IBM, with Dynanet's Mike Rice leading the discussion on DevOps.
